SHARE THE PLATE: This Sunday's recipient is Cass Community Social Services https://casscommunity.org/, a Detroit-based agency dedicated to providing food, housing, health services, and job programs. CCSS prepares and serves 700,000 meals a year. It provides a warming center in winter, an emergency shelter for women and children, coordinates rotating shelters with local organization and permanent supported housing. The agency created Green Industries to link employment with sustainability and to use sales to pay for the new positions. Currently 85 adults have jobs with Green Industries. The Cass Free Medical Clinic offers health screenings, providing simple medications and procedures. During the weekdays, the Cass Activity Center is used by 125 adults with developmental a disabilities where program members decide on personal goals-social, educational, vocational, and recreational.
