Letter from the President...

One of the greatest assets at First Church, I believe, is our current Board of Trustees. The nine-member Board meets on the second Wednesday of the month at 6:30 PM in the Whole Foods Community Room on Mack. I couldn't ask for a better group of members to work with – highly committed and well-informed problem solvers truly accountable to the Congregation.

We were all pleased by Bob Lauer's report at the February 10 meeting that we are doing well in adhering to this year's budget and anticipate receiving the pledged amount. As you know, we had to make some hard staffing decisions at the beginning of this fiscal year. I'm happy to see that we are living up to our fiscal responsibility—covering not only current expenses but addressing past due pension obligations to the Minister. You will be getting more specific updates in the upcoming canvass parties. Your participation is important, and I hope to see you at one of them.

One action of the Board was to approve establishment of a Committee on Ministry to monitor and nurture the health of the ministry of the congregation and serve as a liaison, where appropriate, between the Congregation, the Board and the Minister. The whole purpose is to facilitate a healthy ministry here at First UU Detroit through support, objective counsel and encouragement of the Congregation and the Minister. As stated in Barbara Child's and Keith Kron's book, *In the Interim, Strategies for Interim Ministers and Congregations,* "the goal of a Committee on Ministry is to maintain the equilibrium of the church as a peaceable, thriving body." Following collaboration with Rev. Mohr, the Board appointed Mary Lou Malone (chair), Danny Rebb and Nancy Owen Nelson to serve on the Committee. We don't want it to become a "complaint bureau" but its members are available if you need to share any concerns.

It won't be long before you'll be asked to vote on Board leadership for next year. In the process of discussing Board positions for 2015-16, Colleen Dolan-Greene discovered some discrepancies in the By-laws as a result of changes made at the annual congregational meeting last May. We're now "fly-specking" the By-laws for consistency with those changes and will be presenting proposed amendments to the Congregation beginning in April.

This has been a hard winter. I received an email from one member asking whether we should have the February 15 service because of the weather. I replied that we should have the service and was pleased to see that, despite the snow and frigid temperature, about 40 people filled the church to hear an inspiring message from Rev. Mohr. Coffee, cookies and conversation were especially welcome that day!

From the Welcoming Task Force...

Welcoming Task Force updates: We continue to plan and implement a series of educational programs with the goal of voting to renew First Church's Welcoming Congregation status at the May 2015 annual meeting.

Task Force co-leaders have been participating with members from several other churches in UUA Learning Circle teleconferences led by Carey McDonald, UUA Outreach Director. The discussions centered around branding, which was the original focus of the Welcoming Task Force as it tested the UUA's new outreach program. The testing is completed and we're looking forward to receiving Carey's report on findings.

The congregation-wide common book read/discussion on January 25 was led by Irene Brisson and Danny Rebb on Audre Lorde's essay, "There is No Hierarchy of Oppressions," from Dangerous Liaisons: Blacks, Gays, and the Struggle for Equality and essays by Rev. Michael Tino, "Saved by Love," and Rowan McDowell Thompson, "Love May Not Be Concerned," as well as "A Note on Language" and the "Glossary" from Coming Out in Faith: Voices of LGBTQ Unitarian Universalists. Over 20 members and friends attended. As it turned out, a good deal of the time was taken up by forthright experiences participants shared by way of introductions. The ensuing discussion covered only the "A Note on Language" and the "Glossary." Consequently, the group unanimously agreed to meet again to continue the book discussion. At the committee's February 1 meeting, we agreed to reconvene the discussion.

At that same meeting we approved details for a "community conversation" on March 29 which will be sponsored by Michigan for Marriage, a statewide grassroots public education campaign to build support for marriage equality. Ken Mogill will be in the pulpit. Ken is one of the attorneys in the Michigan marriage rights case – DeBoer v Snyder – being heard at the U.S. Supreme Court in April. His topic, "Reflections on the Struggle for Marriage Equality," will be a personal examination of what marriage is and how the DeBoer case has affected people's views of marriage as a matter of law and social/religious conceptions.

After the worship service on March 29, Michigan for Marriage will sponsor a panel discussion on marriage equality. Gina Calcagno, the Campaign Director of Michigan for Marriage, will participate as a panelist, as will Ken Mogill. Gina will arrange for another panelist and do publicity, supplemented by our advertising subcommittee. Michigan for Marriage will provide light refreshments.

An LGBTQ oral history discussion is also in the works and we've identified a potential speaker. At the time this newsletter went to print, we did not have a date and time set for the discussion, but watch for details soon!

The Task Force is considering how to build relationships and partnerships with LGBTQ-focused organizations. What do we want and need from these relationships? Further programming of an educational nature. What do we have to offer? A spiritual home, the pulpit, advocacy and supporting/attending events. We don't want to rest on our renewal after we obtain it; we want to be an authentic Welcoming Congregation!

Members of the Task Force – Al Acker, Lencha Acker, Irene Brisson, Trey Greene, Mary Lou Malone, Deanna McGraw, Sharon Mills, Danny Rebb, Joan Smykowski, and Kathe Stevens – are happy to provide details. Look for us in social hour. We've got the rainbow tags on our name badges!

We will continue to keep you updated on our progress. Thank you for your support.

On Sunday February 8 we were happy to recognize Al and Lencha Acker as GOOD EGGS! Al and Lencha have been members of 1st UU, Detroit, since the 1970s.

Al wrote the dedication when his son, Chris, was dedicated in 1977. He has been the vice- moderator, moderator and immediate past moderator, along with serving on two search committees and being chair of one of them. He has been a tenor in the choir for many years, wrote brochures for the canvass and capital campaigns, Second Story Church plays and is a trustee of the Church Trust. He was a religious education volunteer teacher and was a host and MC for various dinners and auctions. Currently, Al produces the Vesper service once a month in the mansion.

Lencha has been a member of 1st UU Church for almost 36 years. She first went to the 1st UU Church in Atlanta for a wedding of friends and really like the way they "did church." She was raised as a Lutheran and felt it was too authoritarian and too sexist.

When her son was born, she and Al attended the Detroit church and liked it. She worked on ethnic dinners and worked in religious education, was on two search committees, served on the Board and chaired the Religious Education Committee. She was involved in the Black Concerns Working Group, the Grand Prix and Day of the Dead Services. Lencha has also sung in the choir for over 20 years and as brought the Sunday service flowers for almost 5 years.
