Letter from the President...

President's Letter...

We recently completed the last of four home canvass meetings, and, as always, I enjoyed the opportunity to get to know more of you on a more personal basis and receive your comments from the short survey on what you feel are the church's greatest strengths and the challenges facing us in the next five years. While members mentioned our history, diversity, music and principles as strengths, the overwhelming number of comments centered on the qualities of our congregation (lay leadership, dedicated and resourceful members, problem solvers); spiritual renewal and community (interconnectedness, open mindedness, justice for all); and location (part of a growing and "happening" community).

It's probably no surprise to you that achieving a stable ministry, financial stability and membership growth were mentioned as the top challenges in the next five years. Members hope for a settled minister who recognizes the value of our membership and appreciates the opportunity to work in the city of Detroit. They see the importance of maintaining the growth that we've experienced in the last several years and attracting young families with children. Important, too, is living the mission, welcoming visitors, and increasing our interconnectedness through more programming and a nurturing environment.

This is important information as we enter a period of transition with, hopefully, an interim minister, and, by January of next year, the search for a settled minister. Pledges have been good so far, but we're counting on about 30 of you who have yet to pledge for the 2015-16 budget year. Many members have increased their pledges, which bodes well for our church. If you haven't yet pledged, please do so! Pledges are the major source of operating income for First Church.

The proposed budget that will be presented at the Annual Congregational Meeting on May 17 supports the committees and activities that have grown in the past several years, not only through their budget allocations but through plans for expanded leadership development and training. This will help us all do a more effective job.

Updates from the Welcoming Task Force:

The special collection at the March 29 marriage equality service netted about \$1000 for First UU and \$400 for the <u>National Marriage Challenge</u>, the 501(c)(3) for the <u>DeBoer</u> marriage equality lawsuit. About 70 people attended the March 29 worship service and 30 attended the panel afterwards. Many thanks to our panelists for sharing their stories!

First UU joined over 200 congregations and faith communities participating in Freedom to Marry's National Weekend of Prayer. The Welcoming Task Force thanks Nancy Owen Nelson for graciously incorporating a responsive reading and a prayer into the April 26 worship service to support the legal teams, the plaintiffs and all American families anxiously watching the Supreme Court's deliberations on April 28.

Please join us for the third of our informing and connecting book discussions. On Sunday, May 31, at 12:30 pm, the Welcoming Task Force will present a continuation of our discussion of essays from Dangerous Liaisons: Blacks, Gays, and the Struggle for Equality. On May 31 we'll discuss: Some Queer Notions about Race by Samuel R. Delaney (pages 259-289) and Cornel West on Heterosexism and Transformation: An Interview (pages 290-305). The discussion will be at the church; room TBD. Please advise if you need a copy of the essays. For more information contact Kathe Stevens at kathestevens@gmail.com. It will be great to continue our dialogue and deepen our search!

The Task Force has discussed continuing its activities, or morphing into a committee on outreach, or blending with another committee to work on outreach. Discussions will continue as we count down the days to the expected renewal of our Welcoming Congregation status, which is the end goal of the Task Force as it exists now. Our request for your approval to renew First UU's Welcoming Congregation status will be on the ballot for the May 17 annual congregational meeting!
